


SMC Pays Homage To His Holiness, Pope Francis

The SMC Unice's Story

St. Mary's Convent Inter College Prayagraj was founded in 1866 to provide an all round education to all sections of the society, regardless of caste, creed or financial status. The institution rests in on the foundation of the Congregation of Jesus, by our Venerable foundress Mary Ward, who believed firmly that "Women in time to come will do great things!" We are part of a journey which began with Mary Ward in 1585.

In response to the needs of her time Mary Ward founded the institution in 1609, to cater to the education of girls, with special emphasis on their moral and spiritual foundation.

159 years back, a dream named SMC began with a vision 'spe labor levis'- Hope Lightens Work. Our school was first born as St. Anne's also known as the Convent Girls' Free School, or the Catholic Free School. The earliest records that are available, age back to 1866 when St. Anne's and St. Mary's existed as two separate schools in the same compound. The present Primary school building was in fact the place where St. Anne's once stood.

This is the very same building which has inspired many, has pushed them to dream big and when the time comes, helped to turn those dreams into reality, and fortunately, we're one of those many. If it weren't for the unwavering support of our Principal and the institution itself, this dream of starting a school newspaper would've never found its wings.
